Content of Economists Online – Overview

The first version of Economists Online consists of

- **6 partners with their institutional repositories:** LSE (UK), Tilburg University (NL), Erasmus University Rotterdam (NL), Université Libre de Bruxelles (B), Katholieke Universiteit Leuven (B), & Maastricht University (NL): over **35,000 references** and over **13,000 free full texts**.
- **Complete publication lists from well over 300 authors** in RDF and PDF downloadable format
- all **references from RePEc** (over 0.5 million records) and links to their full texts

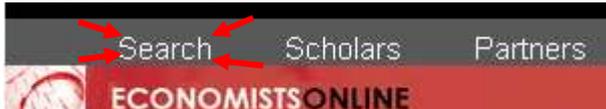

1. **How do you search in Economists Online? The search box**

- You can always come back to the *search page* of Economists Online by clicking on the *Search* link on the Economists Online banner:



- Simply enter your search term or terms in the search box; by default, all metadata fields are searched.
- Start your search by selecting the *search* button ►.

Remark: the search engine is not case sensitive; you can use either upper or lower case letters.

Simple search tips:

To search for an exact expression	Use quotation marks (" ").	Example: "international trade"
To search for plurals / other forms of words	Use a an asterisk (*) for multiple characters. <i>Caution:</i> the closer to the start of a term you use the wildcard, the longer your search will take to process	Example: a search on econom* will find items concerned with <i>economics, economy, economist, economists, economies</i> , etc.

Combine several search terms:

Economists Online allows you to build more complex queries which combine several terms and expressions provided the following *Boolean operators* are used.

AND	When you combine search terms with AND , results will display any item of Economists Online in which both terms appear. Combining search terms in this way makes your search results more precise.	Examples: growth and trade bovenberg and growth
OR	Using OR between search terms allows you to find all items that contain either term; it enlarges your search.	Example: credit or loan
NOT	When you combine search terms with NOT , results will never display any item that contains the search term that is after NOT in your search. NOT should be used with caution: items that contain the first and second terms of your search will <u>not</u> be retrieved.	Example: disclosure not bank This will retrieve documents about <i>disclosure</i> , but neither documents about <i>bank</i> nor over <i>disclosure and bank</i>

Use **parentheses** to combine terms when using at least two different Boolean operators: searching for "human rights" AND Europe OR UK OR Netherlands is not equal to searching for "human rights" AND (Europe OR UK OR Netherlands).

Using facets to search:

Economists Online offers several *facets* to ease searching. Facets only reflect the items that are in Economists Online, e.g. the facet *authors* provides you with a list of all the scholars who have at least one document referenced in Economists Online. The following facets exist:

Collection	This facet provides the institution (repository) where the documents come from, e.g. Tilburg University, RePEc
Year	This facet enables to only look at items that were published a given year; the dates are ordered as ascending year
Publication type	Available publication types are: article, annotation, bachelor thesis, book, book chapter, book review, contribution to periodical, conference paper, doctoral thesis, lecture, master thesis, preprint, student thesis, working paper
Classification	The facet JEL code may be used to retrieve items that are concerned with certain topics, e.g. G14 will retrieve documents about <i>Information and market</i> (for a list of valid JEL codes see: http://www.aeaweb.org/journal/jel_class_system.html)
Language	Select the language of the documents you would like to read
Journal / Series	This facet provides the Journal or series titles of items

To display only items that belong to a given facet, simply click on this facet. This facet is then displayed on top of the facets area below the *Selected facets* heading. You can always deselect a chosen facet by clicking on it.

You may also select several facets, even from different types; e.g. to search if a given author has written documents on a specific subject, select both the author as a first facet, and the specific subject as a second facet.

Searches according to the selected facets are automatically started each time a facet is selected or deselected.

You may also [refine your search](#) with one or more facet(s).

2. Refining your search

Economists Online allows the user to refine a search, e.g. when the number of results obtained after a search is too high, through the use of *facets*.

Caution: selecting facets *after a performed search* will only display items relevant to the user's original search criteria and that correspond to the selected facets. The number of displayed results will hence be lower than the number of results obtained from a search conducted without selecting any facet.

Facets are used to further *limit* the number of items displayed showing records related to a particular facet, e.g. author, language.

3. Now what? Work with your results

- You can decide on how many results you want displayed per screen *before* you start a search: choose between 15, 25 and 50. The default is 15.
- References are presented using the American Psychological Association (APA) bibliographic style followed by the JEL codes that are specific to EO.
- To automatically retrieve all Economists Online items from a scholar (the search is then performed on the scholar's last name), or described by a specific JEL code, belonging to a journal/series characterised by its title: simply click, from an item of the displayed results, on one of the searchable terms: they are displayed as hyperlinks.
Caution: this will start a new search through Economists Online. If you only want to retrieve items that match your search criteria, together with one of the criteria mentioned above, you will have to build a new search by [combining several terms](#), or [refine your search](#) via facets.
- Each title is accompanied by a small tool bar with icons and buttons which shows the publication type of the title, leads to the full text or further actions. The following icons and buttons will appear:

	OpenURL button	The OpenURL button can transmit reference data to specific library services of your institution. This will help you to retrieve the item in the local resources of your institution. If your institution's library has an OpenURL resolver and is registered at the WorldCat Link Registry, the Open URL links to the record of that publication in the library's resources (catalogue, databases, E-Journals). Examples: The OpenURL can link to a fee-based full-text version of the publication in case the open access version is not available or link to an institutional inter-library loan service, in case the publication is not available at all in full-text.
	Open / close the expansion box with full text files	A click on the buttons will open or close the expansion box with a link to full text files and information on the filetype. Buttons appear only when a full text is available.
	Open / close the expansion box with abstract	A click on the buttons will open or close the expansion box with an abstract. Buttons appear only when an abstract is available.

4. Other options available in Economists Online

- Your query is always displayed in the search box.
- You can go directly to the top of the search results by clicking on the  icon.
- Should you want to learn more about Nereus or Economists Online: simply click on the logo  or  and you are taken to the relevant home pages.

1. Alphabetical list of Economists Online scholars

By clicking a letter the page is positioned to the anchor point of that letter in the list.



The list of scholars contains

- the full name and title of the scholar together with a button that leads to the [Economists Online Scholar details screen](#) providing you with more information on that scholar and his/her publication list.
- the name of the institution the scholar is affiliated with and a button that leads to the [Economists Online Partners screen](#) providing you with further information on that institution.
- the name of the department within the institution and a button that leads to the [Economists Online Partner's Department Scholars screen](#).

1. What is the *Scholars details* screen about?

This screen will provide you with details related to each scholar who participates in Economists Online, as follows:

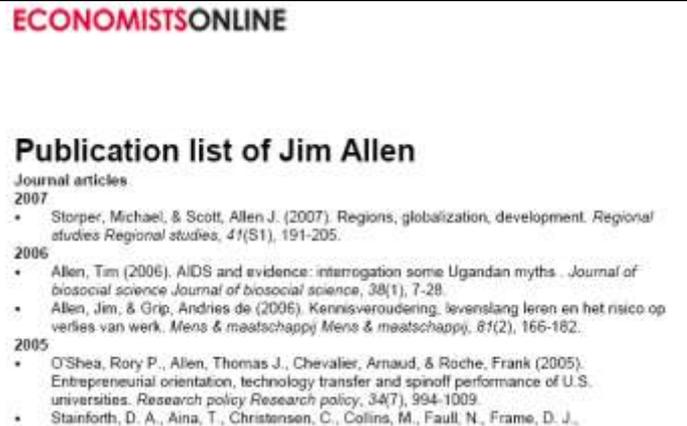
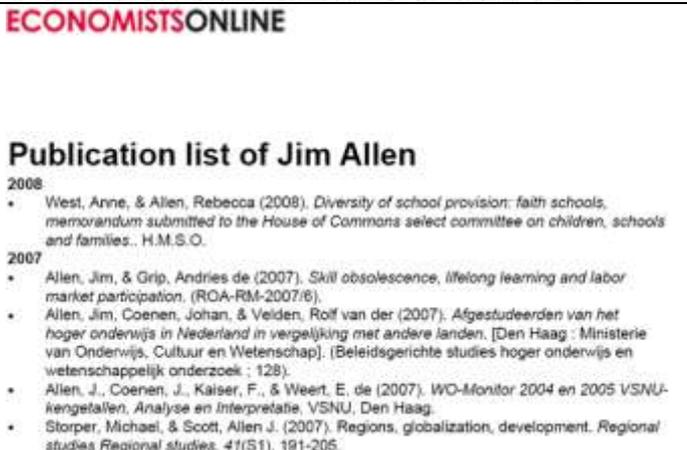
The *scholar's icon bar*:
